20-Oct	51.33152	3.68793	beirvliet	In reserve behind 8th and 9th Brigades.
21-Oct	51.36529	3.59585	Sasput	It was decided that two coys of the SCOTTISH would go forward to reinforce the H.L.I. of C at sq 1115 and to take over that posn when the H.L.I. moved in to attack SCHOONDIJKE 0914. the 9th Cdn Inf Bde is engaged in clearing the way for the capture of BRESKENS and FORT FREDERIK HENDRIK. When they have accomplished that the 7th Cdn Inf Bde will follow through with a thrust along the coast to the west.
22-Oct	51.37556	3.60646	Sasput	The situation did not change during the night but the morning's news was good meaning that it was now possible to move the remainder of the Bn forward to concentrate in the region of SASPUT (1216) Every advance means that the pocket of enemy resistance is decreasing and ANTWERP'S harbour facilities are soon to be used.
24-Oct	51.40225	3.51918	Breskins	Contiued to push forward. Christopher Cadeau joined the CanScots as part of 34 man reinforcement.
25-Oct	51.39198	3.53449	Breskins	Moving forward. Word Fort Fredrick Hendrik had fallen to persistent artillery and air attack.
26-Oct	51.39377	3.53433	Breskins	The dykes are riddled with dugouts, and small pockets of Germans are found on a regular basis.
27-Oct	51.39237	3.52006	Breskins	The Coys began what was to prove to be a very difficult day. "A" Coy had kept on but were now enduring painfully heavy shelling. Allwent well until suddenly 9 PI found itself fired on by machine guns at point-blank range. They were travelling along a road at the foot of a dyke and were met by a hail of fire from all sides. The enemy had allowed them to pass through and had then closed in. It was a well-planned and well-executed manoeuvre by the defending Paratroopers of the German Army. 9 PI's runner, Pte Bowling, was sent back to warn Coy HQ of the situation. A bloody battle ensued with every ounce of fighting energy that the gallant "A" Coy men possessed. 4 CanScots were killed including

				Christoper Cadeau, 5 wounded and 40 missing.
28-Oct	51.37892	3.5471700	Breskins	The pocket is growing smaller every day but still the hard core of resistance of the enemy is not broken. He simply retires to another prepared position and awaits the inevitable attack. Clearing the strong points continued all day.
29-Oct	51.38202	3.4562300	Nieuwvliet-Bad	The day was not seriously active. Contact patrols had been successful during the night and had reported no enemy action. A few PsW continued to be brought in from their hiding places.
30-Oct	51.38389	3.4330400	Cadzand	"C" Coy was sent to clear the village of CADZAND. They had a successful mission and reported the information to BnHQ. Much interesting knowledge was found in this former German HQ. 9th Brigade to move through.

31-Oct	51.38299	3.4331200	Cadzand	SCOTTISH, were able to advance slightly. "D" Coy found that the enemy were holding the line of the CADZAND KANAL with concentrated small arms and mortar fire. The situation was the same for "B" Coy. This last pill-box seems to be occupied by the "last man, last round" type of German defenders. Perhaps it will be necessary to use something other than the mortars and Brens to close this chapter of their existence.
01-Nov	51.37601	3.3891500	Cadzand	Battles are uncompromising affairs and do not cooperate by ceasing with the month-end. Thus, the death knell of the CADZAND "pocket" must be tolled during November. The final enemy resistance in the area was a pill-box and trench system around the Life-saving Station at 975178. Their 20m m fire showed that they had plenty of ammunition and the inclination to use it to keep us at arm's length. The C Coy Patrol which was investigating the enemy posn concluded that the job of clearing the enemy would require more than their tiny force.
02-Nov	51.36303	3.3788400	Cadzand	B Coy, from their posn forward and left of the C.P., relayed the information that the enemy seemed greatly shaken up. Well they might be. An exploding shell causes thunderous roars inside the concrete-walled rooms even though the shells cannot penetrate those thick structures. More worries for the Germans ! 330 The surrender had been complete and unconditional. Immediately, our Commanding Officer proceeded to Bde HQ with his prize package of PsW. Then the same old sorry lines of prisoners began filing out from the forts. Weary, dirty, gaunt-looking German Infantry and Paratroops, clad in the usual long greatcoats of sickly green colour, trudged mournfully pastxx our posns and on to the CAGE.
